## **The Reservist Proposition**

"These changes amount to a paradigm shift in the role of Reservists in delivery of the nation's Security"

- The Secretary of State for Defence

- Reservists will now have access to the latest kit, will train alongside regular units and will have increased opportunities to train overseas.
- Reservists will have the training and support to undertake the full range of military tasks including overseas capacity building and responding to crises at home.
- Reservists will now have a paid leave entitlement and will have access to the Future Armed Forces Pension Scheme.
- Reservists will continue to be paid a tax-free annual bounty restructured to reward your commitment and achievement more effectively.
- Reservists will have access to Standard Learning Credits to enhance their educational or vocational achievements.
- Reservists will now receive better access to welfare support.
- Reservists have access to Occupational Health Support whether or not they are mobilised.
- Reservists will be supported by the Defence Rehabilitation Service if they are injured during training or mobilisation.
- Reservists will get improved notice of when they will be expected to train or mobilise.
- The Ministry of Defence will legislate to provide Reservists with right of access without a qualifying employment period, to the Employment Tribunal if a Reservist is unfairly dismissed on account of their reserve service.
- The Ministry of Defence will gather evidence on Reservists being disadvantaged in, or when seeking, employment, follow up individual cases and, if the evidence justifies it, consideration will be given to additional measures, including whether to provide additional protection in the next Armed Forces Bill.
- There will be incentives available for ex-regulars to join Reserves, including a transfer bonus for those in the Army.
