NEW DIRECTOR RESERVES INCOMING!

John (Mark) Lancaster, Baron Lancaster of Kimbolton assumes the role of Director Reserves in October 2023 in the rank of Major General.

The Director Reserves' role is to optimise Reserve utility, talent and societal networks through Army HQ strategy, policy and Engagement and Communications (E&C) outputs. The role delivers this through: the provision of advice across the 4* HQ on all Reserve policy matters; fostering the development of Reserve strategy; ensuring cross-stakeholder Reserve matters are coordinated; and the reinforcement of Reserve E&C. As the senior Army Reservist, Director Reserves also works with the Deputy Chief of the General Staff and the Assistant Chief of the General Staff to champion a Whole Force Approach across all Army activities.

Mark served on a gap year commission in the Army between 1988 and 1990. He was a company director for the family fireworks firm, Kimbolton Fireworks, before he was elected to Parliament and continues to serve in the Army Reserves as a Colonel; this has included operational tours in Kosovo (1999 to 2000), Bosnia (2001 to 2002) and Afghanistan (2006).
